Inland Counties Legal Services

ICLS provides free legal assistance to low-income persons. Primary law practice areas are family law, landlord/tenant, elder law, consumer debt and public benefits. To find out if you qualify for free legal assistance, call the ICLS office nearest to you.

Tenant Landlord Assistance Project (TLAP)

ICLS provides legal information on landlord tenant law to both sides (landlord or tenant, plaintiff or defendant) in eviction cases pending in the Riverside Civil Court. Handouts are available to both landlords and tenants representing themselves, regardless of their income or assets.

General legal information on the eviction process is available at the Tenant Landlord Assistance Project (TLAP) located in the Moreno Valley Court at 13800 Heacock St., Building D, 2nd Floor, Suite 201, Room 211, Moreno Valley, CA. *See Schedule.*

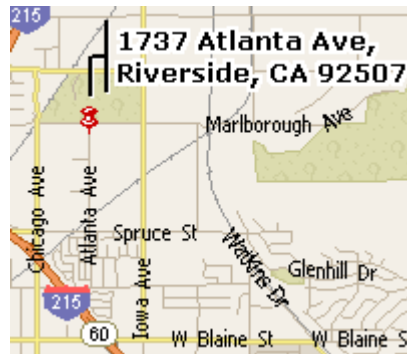
Attorney representation of eligible low-income clients in unlawful detainer (eviction) cases is available to landlords or tenants, on a *first-come, first-served* basis every day. To find out if you are eligible, be at Department MV1UD *no later than 12:45 p.m.* to be screened for client eligibility and conflicts of interest. ICLS has the sole discretion to accept or reject a case.

You may also be given an office appointment at ICLS's Client Services Center - Housing Hotline Office.

Monday - Thursday:

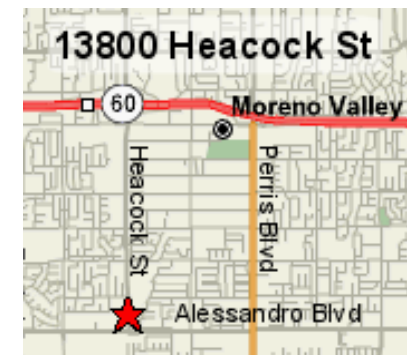
No later than 12:45 p.m.
